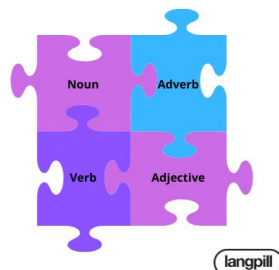


# ENGLISH SENTENCE - SENTENCE TYPES



## English Sentence - Four Sentence Types

There are four sentence types.

Declarative (statement)

Interrogative (question)

Imperative (command)

Exclamative (exclamation)

## English Sentence - Four Sentence Types

### Declarative Sentence - Statement

Tells information or makes a statement.

Punctuation Mark: Period

Positive: Subject + Verb	Negative: Subject + Aux Verb + Not + Verb
I like apples.	I do not like apples.
He likes apples.	He does not like apples.

## English Sentence - Four Sentence Types

### Interrogative Sentence - Question

Asks for information or response.

Punctuation: Question Mark

Question Words(QW): Who, What, When, Why, Where, How

Positive : Aux Verb + Subject + Verb	Negative: Aux Verb + Subject + not + Verb
Positive: QW + Aux Verb + Subject + Verb	Negative: QW + Aux Verb + Subject + not + Verb
Do you like apples?	Did you not like apples?(Didn't you like apples?)
Why do you like apples?	Why does he not like apples? (Why doesn't he like apples?)

## English Sentence – Four Sentence Types

English Sentence Structure Course

### Imperative Sentence - Command

Tells an instruction that must be done.

Punctuation Mark: Period, Exclamation Mark

Usually no subject.

Positive: Base Verb	Negative: Aux Verb + Not + Verb
Look!	Do not look! (Don't look!)
Look at the board!	Do not look at the board!
John Look! (with subject)	John do not look! (with subject)

## English Sentence – Four Sentence Types

English Sentence Structure Course

### Exclamative Sentence - Exclamation

Express strong emotion or surprise.

Punctuation Mark: Exclamation Mark

What (+ adjective) + noun + subject + verb	How (+ adjective/adverb) + subject + verb
What a juicy apple I'm eating!	How exciting the game was!
